Animal Welfare Act 2006

It is an offence under the Animal Welfare Act to cause any unnecessary suffering to any captive or domestic animal. Fireworks must not be set off near livestock or horses in fields, or close to buildings that house livestock. The offence carries a fine of up to £20,000 and/or a prison term of up to six months. The act is enforced by local councils, animal health officers and the police.

Please DO NOT USE Scout Post stamps on cards posted through Royal Mail post boxes. They are not valid and the receiver will have to pay a surcharge.

PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

NEXT MEETING - 6th November at the CPB Village Hall

GRANT APPLICATIONS

1. Applications should be received by the Parish Council by the 1st November.

2. Retrospective applications will not be funded where the expenditure had been made, the project has been carried out or the event has taken place.
3. All grants will be conditional upon submission of audited accounts and supporting documentation detailing costs of capital expenditure, project or events for which the funding is being sought, and how this will benefit the community.
4. Grants for services or goods in excess of £500 will require two quotes.
5. All grant recipients are required to provide the Parish Council with a brief report, including photographs where appropriate, of how the grant has been utilised, how it has assisted the organisation or group and what it has achieved. This must be submitted within two months of the purchase of the capital equipment or completion of the project.
6. If the grant is put to purposes other than those for which it was awarded without the prior approval of the Parish Council, the recipient organisation or group will be required to repay the grant to the Parish Council.
7. The organisation or group should supply such information as the Parish Council may request regarding the impact of the project on the Parish Council's area.
8. Recognition of the grant from Clyffe Pypard Parish Council must be made in any publicity.

View from the Vicarage

On connections far and wide November 2018

We will be coming towards the end of our marking of 100 years, 100 days as November begins and I have found that the experience of that time from 3 August until 10 November has deepened and challenged my thinking about what it means to mark the centenary of Armistice Day 1918.

Perhaps in part because many who have fought and lived through wars do not speak easily of what they have seen and remembered, the focus on these centenary years seems to have encouraged many people to explore, research and remember their own family and local connections to the wars marked in the season of Remembrance.

In Broad Town, one of our local history detectives is Clive Green who became intrigued by the mention on a gravestone in the churchyard there of a mother's son, Frank Comley, who fought in the 1914-8 war but yet was not named on the war memorial in church. It turns out that Frank had emigrated to Halifax, Nova Scotia and then enlisted from Canada, rather than as a local Wiltshire man. I'm always struck by the courage and determination of those who moved from these islands in search of a better life in the days before air travel and the internet made remaining in touch across such distance relatively easy.

It also reminds me that our connections cross counties, countries and continents both in the past and in the present. It won't take much thought about your family, friends and neighbours in these villages to discover connections from migration and leisure to many of

the continents of the world. I'm often thankful for these connections of trade and culture as I drink my cup of tea and eat food enriched by this network of travel.

But this is even more so as I give thanks for the legacy of a small group of people from a foreign culture, who during a period of occupation by a foreign empire, experienced a transformation of their traditional religion through the life, teaching and death of a first century leader. This leader inspired the idea that in the end across the richness of our differences it is not our economic status, or our national or ethnic background, nor our gender that determines our identity but our commitment to follow a spiritual path of love, truth and peace.*

In all the amazing connections that bridge our planet it is this connection of my faith with its earliest followers that adds hope that through the losses of war, and the viciousness of hatreds a path towards peace and justice can yet be found.

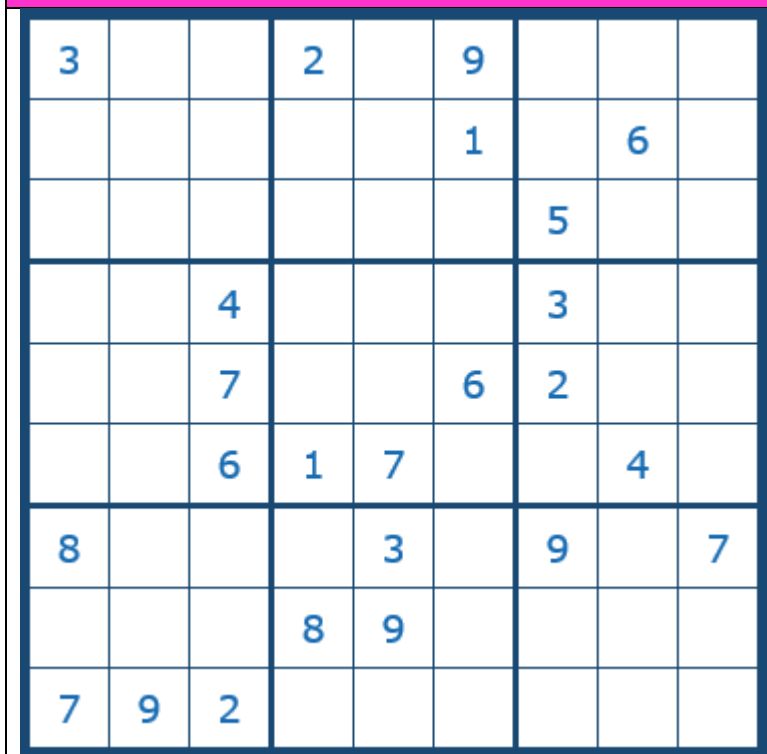

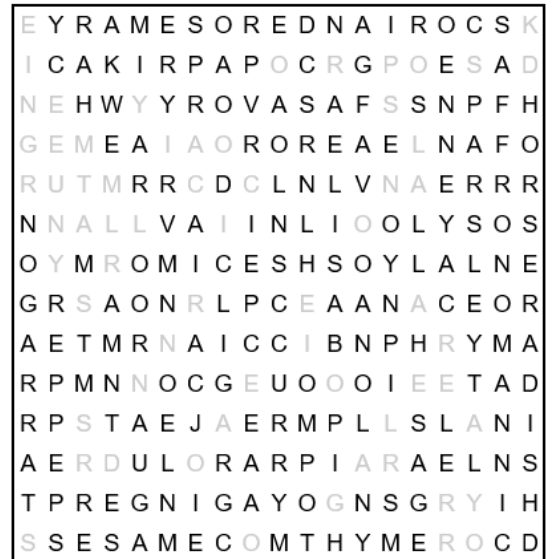

Wiltshire Community Foundation is delighted to announce funding for the community from Science Museum Group Wroughton Solar Park.

The solar park started to generate power in July 2016 and funding is available to benefit the community in the surrounding area.

Applications are now open for community groups to apply for small grants funding of up to £2k for community organisations, working to improve the lives of people living in the parish areas of Wroughton, Chiseldon, Clyffe Pypard, Broad Town, Broad Hinton, Ogbourne St George, Ogbourne St Andrew, Aldbourne and Baydon. In addition, applications are also open for grants of up to £20k for any community organisation, including schools for projects that have a focus on science, technology, engineering, maths, environment, health, play.

Examples might be the use of renewable energy, ecology or habitat conservation. Projects can be for the creation of a physical asset or for the encouragement of learning i.e. for delivering a specific benefit to the area or providing education about a particular issue. Grants can be for capital or revenue costs.

The project must deliver benefit to communities within a 10km radius of Wroughton Solar Park.
